

Kanawemawasowin Kamik Hosts Naming Ceremony

September 14, 2019 - Chrystal Littlechild-Hill and Debbie Strongman-Omeasoo of Kanawemahwasowin Kamik hosted a naming ceremony for children and families of children in care. Kenneth Roan and oskapewis, Edwin Frencheater, Lorraine White, Ida Bull and helpers Noreen and Carol held the ceremony at Kenneth Roan's private residence in Mameo. Dozens of people were in attendance. During the ceremony, there was singing for the children and explanations for why the names were chosen. Chrystal Littlechild-Hill spoke to the assembled, giving some history to the event, "What we've been doing in Ermineskin is going through a process, we've been listening to our community and working with our elders

and our leadership and our citizens. We're really bringing our children back home to where they belong... through ceremony. We're ceremony people. Many of our children have very limited opportunity to (attend ceremony) when they grow up in a system. And a system that isn't ours or built by us." Elder Ken Roan said that the names will be used in an opposing fashion of the Indian registration system, that the Cree names will be a way to register our children back into our Nation and our way of life.

Elder Ken Roan spoke before the beginning of the ceremony, "Tatawaw... it's a good day for a spiritual ceremony gathering, this

is what we do. This is what are grandparents did for us. When we were little children, it's a nurturing of gratitude for me, myself, my brother Edwin. The way our [grandparents] took us in. Conditioning us in this way of life, this ceremony way of ours... I'm really thankful for how far it took me... We call them law lodges (the ceremonies), where all people come, all walks of life, to our ceremonies... we welcome. To come as one people, one tribe, with one mind, one heart, one spirit."

Following the ceremony, there was a feast. At the end of the event attendees were invited to the Pigeon Lake Recreation Center.

Chiefs Sign Buffalo Treaty at Nipisihkopahk Secondary School

September 20, 2019 - A special Buffalo Treaty event was celebrated with the Governor General Awards in Samson.

A reenactment of the Treaty Six signing was performed at the Jonas Applegarth Theatre. There were also speakers Dr. Leroy Littlebear and Dennis Omeasoo.

Dr. Leroy Littlebear spoke about the nature of the traditional world view as opposed to that of colonizers. "For us, the world is always in flux, it is always changing."

Dennis Omeasoo introduced his work with Regina Catholic Schools, sharing the Winter Count Buffalo Robe bundle and its significance; "a collection of prayers acquired through spiritual ceremonies involving all people affected by residential schools."

Following the speakers was the signing of new signatories to the Buffalo Treaty. The Buffalo Treaty was first signed in 2014 with the Blackfeet Nation, Blood Tribe, Siksika Nation, Piikani Nation, among others. They invited the Chiefs of the Four Nations

in Maskwacis to sign. The treaty was created to "honour, recognize, and revitalize the time immemorial relationship we have with Buffalo" (The Buffalo: A Treaty of Cooperation, Renewal and Restoration). ~article/photos by Sara Lee~

Court Approved Indian Day School

In case you missed the Information session that was hosted on September 17:

Key Questions	Info
What if I was in Day School and went to Residential School?	You are eligible if you attended an Indian Day School for the period of time listed in Schedule K of the Settlement Agreement. You can be eligible for Day School and Day Scholar if you attended both. They are separate actions. There is no current Settlement Agreement for Day Scholars. You are still eligible if you were compensated through the IRS process.
What is the difference between registering and submitting a claim?	Being registered allows Gowling WLG to contact you with important updates. Gowling WLG is the legal firm available for free advice and questions. To register call 1 (844) 539-3815 or go to https://ca.gowlingwlg.com/dayschoolclassaction/
Where can I submit my claim?	Being registered does not qualify you for compensation. Compensation will be determined by a designated Claims Administrator that is not Gowling WLG. More information on the Claims Administrator and contact information will be forthcoming.
When can I submit my claim?	"The Claims Process is not yet available. The Claims Form can be reviewed and documents prepared pending the opening up of the Claims Process after November 19, 2019."
Can I make a claim for a loved one or family member that has passed away?	"The ESTATE of a Class Member who died on or after July 31, 2007 can make a claim on behalf of the deceased. If the deceased has no will or executor, then an Estate Administrator will need to be appointed. Representatives of estates should begin the process of estate administration as soon as possible." Contact Membership for forms or INAC at Phone (toll-free): 1-800-567-9604.
What is the deadline to apply?	Once the Claims Process has opened, Class Members will have 2.5 years to submit their claim.
Is the Claims Form difficult? Do I need to provide school records?	Level 1 claimants do not need to provide additional documentation. "Some additional information and documents are required to support claims for higher levels of compensation, but those who cannot obtain documents can provide a Sworn Declaration included on the Claims Form."
I attended an Ermineskin school, am I eligible?	Students who attended the Ermineskin primary, elementary, and Jr high schools from 1969 - 1991 as well as those students who attended the Ermineskin Kindergarten from 1970 - 1991 are eligible.
What can I do at this moment?	Register with Gowling WLG. Obtain letters of administration for deceased family members if applicable. Review Claims Form and collect supporting documentation if required (see level 2-5 harms).

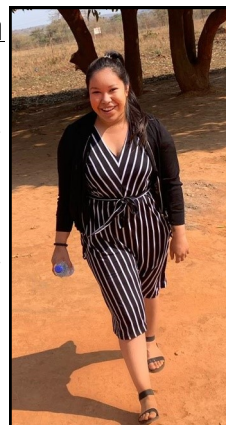

In this internship, you either get placed in Uganda or Zambia. I am placed in the small town of Lundazi, Zambia working with the Rising Fountains organization. Rising Fountains focuses on community development in which we have a number of current projects based on women's rights and local governance, human rights, HIV/AIDS, improved forest management, and financial services and livelihood in women! Living in Zambia has not only achieved my goal of self-growth, I have also gained so much knowledge on global issues in accordance to good governance, environment, and gender. I'm so excited to continue learning and to share everything I've learned back home! Coming into this internship, I had no idea what to expect. I only had a personal goal of self-growth and to learn about myself and it was an opportunity to get away from home for a few months, I had no idea that this would be so much more than just self-growth. It was quickly during the pre-departure briefing when learning about Africa that I realized the change I want to make in Er-

The ceremony began with an honor song performed by the school drum group, coinciding with a raising of the flags. Elder Marvin Littlechild spoke to the assembled students, which included a delegation of student and staff visitors from Ashoro, Japan. His speech in Cree and English was about the history and importance of the signing of Treaty Six. Chief Bobtail signed the adhesion on September 25, 1877 at Blackfoot Crossing, and Ermineskin celebrates Bobtail day on this day every year.

Cadence Dion, an EJSHS grade 12 student, danced for the staff, students, and guests from Japan. Following her dance the students from Ashoro sang 2 songs, one in Japanese, the other an English cover of “A Whole New World” from the Aladdin movie soundtrack.

“In the spirit of friendship,” the Japanese students were invited to stand in a circle and were then joined by staff and students from EJSHS in a round dance.

Be Safe and Be Seen

Ermineskin Reserve

Road Safety

During this autumn change of season, the farmers are busy in the fields. This means an increase in slow-moving equipment on reserve roads, which can create a hazard. Remember to share the road. **Be safe and be seen. Keep these in mind,**

- Be aware of slow-moving farm machinery. The typical speed of a piece of farm machinery is 30-40 km/hour. You need to slow down to react! Be patient.
- Watch for vehicles marked with slow-moving vehicle signs (a bright orange triangle with a red border) and flashing amber lights.
- Equipment is large and may take up more than one lane.
- Do not drive in equipment blind spots where operators cannot see you. Keep back a safe distance — at least 50 feet, when following.
- Never assume. Watch for hand signals. Just because a tractor veers right does not mean the operator is pulling over for you to pass.
- Be aware of intersections where farm equipment might turn. Also, equipment might unexpectedly turn onto a public road from a field or driveway.
- Do not expect equipment to run partly on the road shoulders. Farm machinery operators will stay on roadways whenever possible.

Electons Canada

To vote, you must be a Canadian citizen and at least 18 years old on election day.

- Make sure you're registered at your current address**
Visit elections.ca to check your registration now.
- Watch for your voter information card in the mail**
If you're registered, you will get a voter information card in the mail after the election is called. It tells you where and when you can vote. Check the name and address on the card. If there are errors, or if you don't receive a card, visit elections.ca or call 1-800-463-6868 to update your voter information.
- Make a plan to vote**
You can vote almost any time during the election period; visit elections.ca to choose the voting option that works best for you.

Bring ID when you go to vote

Here are your options:

Option 1:
Show one piece of government-issued ID with your photo, name and current address. For example: your driver's licence.

Option 2:
Show two pieces of ID. Both must have your name, and at least one must have your current address. For example: your voter information card and a bank statement, or a utility bill and your student ID card.

Option 3:
If you don't have ID, you can still vote if you declare your identity and address in writing and have someone who knows you and who is assigned to your polling station vouch for you.
The voucher must be able to prove their identity and address. A person can vouch for only one person (except in long-term care institutions).

Advance Voting for Ermineskin residents for the election will be October 11-14 (Fri/Sat/Sun/Mon), 2019 from 9AM-9PM at the Ermineskin Mall. You can register to vote at NHS on September 30, 2019 from 10AM-3PM, and at the Ermineskin Mall on October 7-8, 2019 from 9AM-5PM.
