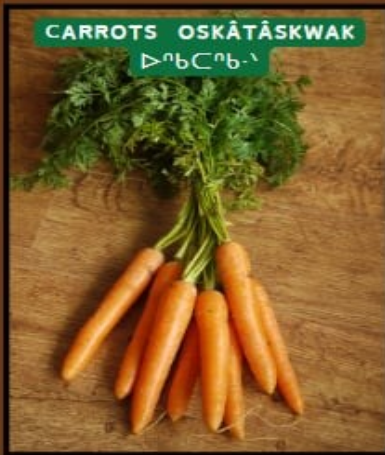

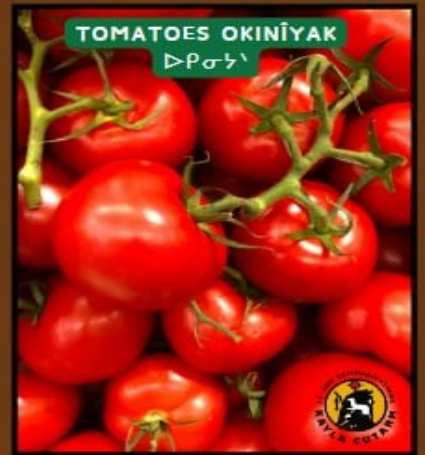

Ermineskin Post Secondary

The Ermineskin Post Secondary Student Program provides sponsorship to eligible Ermineskin Tribal students who registered in and are attending a Post Secondary Institution. In addition, every student must meet all requirements and be accepted by a recognized and accredited public/

private Post Secondary Institution.

When applying to college or universities begin in November or December. Most institutes treat applications on first come first serve basis. If for any reason your application for funding does not get approved then write your institute and ask for a leave of absence for a specific time period. There are a few forms that come with the application package whether it be for a new applicant or a continuing/returning student.

Types of Educational Sponsorship

Tuition and Fee's:

- The cost of tuition will be paid directly to the post secondary institution that the student will be attending.

Application, Registration, Rescheduled Exam and Transcript(s) Request Fee's:

- It is the responsibility of the student to pay the above fees. However, cost of one (1) application or registration fee for the initial term will be reimbursed providing that a receipt is submitted and upon acceptance from post secondary institute.

Books and Supplies:

- The cost of textbooks and supplies will be made payable to the student at the beginning of each term according to rate determined in policies, students attending M.C.C books are paid when invoiced.

Post Secondary Living Allowance:

- Living allowances are given to full-time students (full course loads) and are based upon on or off reserve rates.

In order to keep your application moving along, remember to apply early, sign your application (some applicants forget), and insure every part of your application is complete—missing information can affect the process of the application.

Program policy specifics that you need to be aware of is once students begin a program all deadline dates should be noted. For example, if a student is going to drop a course it is usually a week after the first the first day of classes for a drop day otherwise Ermineskin Education post Secondary has to pay for the course. If students have to drop a course during the course of the semester then drop forms have to be signed with the institute first and then with Ermienskin Education Post Secondary.

Overall, education is the foundation upon which individuals and our community build a brighter future, enabling progress, prosperity, and social justice. Education empowers individuals by providing them with knowledge, skills, and critical thinking abilities, enabling them to make informed decisions and pursue opportunities that lead to personal and professional growth. Ermineskin Cree Nation will continue to support our youth and members to peruse



further education.

CHILDREN AND YOUTH INCENTIVES

ANNUAL AWARDS NIGHT




KINDERGARTEN TO GRADE 12

Eligibility - The Child & Youth incentive program is for all ECN students enrolled in kindergarten to Grade 12 no matter where they reside.



HOW TO APPLY

It is the student/parent/caregivers responsibility to apply and provide the EETF office manager with report cards in a timely manner following the end of each academic school year with a final report card when they become available.



ATTENDANCE

Kindergarten to Grade 2 - 70%
 Grade 3-6 - 90%
 Grade 7-9 - 90%
 Grade 10-12 - 90%

Gift cards will be awarded to students who achieve the above attendance percentages.

SPECIAL ACHIEVEMENTS

Students in the following grades are eligible who receive an average of 80% or higher in their academic year.

- Grade 9 - \$75.00
- Grade 10 - \$100.00
- Grade 11 - \$200.00
- Grade 12 - \$300.00

EXTRACURRICULAR AWARDS & GENERAL INTEREST

Extracurricular Award - for students who completed or participated in an extracurricular activity that promotes physical, spiritual, intellectual and mental development. Students will receive \$35.00 for each award.

General Interest Awards are for students who have been recognized from their school for special year long awards. Monthly awards are ineligible.



ANNUAL AWARDS NIGHT

SECONDARY & POST-SECONDARY COMPLETIONS

HIGH SCHOOL/SECONDARY COMPLETION AWARDS

Chief Dan Minde Award - for completion of a Grade 12 Diploma or a Knowledge and Employability Diploma (K&E) - \$1000.00
 (Canadian Adult Education Credential), - \$500.00
 must complete an application form and provide a physical copy to the EETF office manager.

GEORGE WOLFE MEMORIAL AWARD

Will be awarded to post-secondary students who successfully complete a full time program from an accredited institution. Students must submit a copy of certificate/diploma/degree to the office manager. Students can also submit their official transcripts and a convocation parchment once received.

OTHER PROGRAMS

Indigenous Skills and Employment Training & Neyaskweyahk Human Services Programs offered to ECN members on/off reserve are eligible for an incentive once per academic year.

AWARDS

Awards will be granted under the following:

- ISET & NHS Offered Programs - 1 to 4 months = \$100.00
- Certificate/Diploma - 4 to 8 months = \$500.00
- Diploma - 8 to 20 months = \$1500.00
- Undergraduate Bachelor's Degree - 40 month programs = \$2000.00
- Professional Degrees (i.e. Law & Medicine) = \$3000.00
- Masters = \$4000.00
- Doctoral Degrees = \$5000.00

TRADES COMPLETION AWARD - CHIEF BOBTAILAWARD

Chief Bobtail Awards for apprenticeship Completion - students must submit a copy of transcripts/certificate showing completion of trades program, and submit a copy a Red Seal if applicable.

Rates for Incentives:
 Year 4 Journeyman = \$1000.00
 Red Seal = \$2000.00

POWWOW ESSENTIALS

Powwows are celebrations of our indigenous culture, traditions, and heritage. They provide a platform to the communities to showcase the traditional dances, music, regalia, and arts to both Indigenous and non-Indigenous people. A powwow also serve as a healing ceremony and promoting wellness within the community. It also assists in promoting mental and emotional well-being, and fostering a sense of belonging and empowerment among participants. These celebrations will continue to serve as vibrant expression of identity, resilience, and strength. Keeping that in mind, it is important that you are prepared for a long weekend at the powwow.



Here's a list of essentials to consider bringing:

1. Comfortable Clothing and Footwear

First and foremost, it's important to dress comfortably for the powwow, as you'll likely be spending a lot of time on your feet. Opt for lightweight, breathable clothing that allows you to move freely, and don't forget to check the weather forecast before heading out. Albuquerque's climate can be unpredictable, so it's always a good idea to be prepared for whatever Mother Nature has in store for us. In case there is rain, pack some necessities as umbrella, raincoat/poncho's and extra blanket.. If you choose to camp be sure to pack tarps.

In addition to comfortable clothing, be sure to wear sturdy, supportive footwear suitable for walking and standing for extended periods. The pow wow grounds can span a large area, with various performances, vendor booths, and activities spread out throughout the venue. A pair of comfortable shoes will ensure that you can explore everything the powwow has to offer without getting uncomfortable.

2. Sun Protection

Albuquerque is known for its abundant sunshine, and with the pow wow being at the end of April, it is no exception. Be sure to pack plenty of sun protection to shield yourself from the harsh rays of the New Mexico sun. This includes sunscreen with a high SPF, sunglasses to protect your eyes, and a wide-brimmed hat to shade your face and neck. Trust me, you'll be grateful for these items when you're spending hours outdoors enjoying the festivities.

3. Cash

While many vendors at the pow wow accept credit cards, it's always a good idea to carry some cash with you just in case. From delicious food and refreshing drinks to authentic Native American crafts and souvenirs, there's no shortage of tempting offerings to indulge in at the pow wow. Having cash on hand will allow you to support local artisans and businesses without having to worry about finding an ATM.

4. Water Bottle/Snacks & Food

Staying hydrated is key to enjoying a long day at the pow wow, especially if you're spending time outdoors in the sun. Be sure to bring a reusable water bottle with you and refill it regularly throughout the day. Many pow wow venues offer water stations where you can top up your bottle for free, so you can stay hydrated without having to spend money on bottled water. Also, important if you are not wanting to purchase food from vendors to pack snacks in a cooler or cooler bag that will last you through the day. Fruit, veggies, sandwiches etc...

5. Comfortable Seating

Bring a folding chair or blanket to sit on, as Powwows often involve hours of sitting and observing. Many powwows have public seating but seats fill up fast, it's a good idea to bring lawn chairs or folding chairs in case the public seating in the arbor is taken.

These are some suggestions to consider when attending powwows throughout the summer. We hope that provides you with more insight when attending these gatherings as it's always important to be prepared. Enjoy the powwows, stay safe and have fun!


