Indigenous Veteran's Day Ceremony









On November 8th, the Montana Cree Nation and Maskwacis Cree Tribal Council held the annual Veterans Day Ceremony at the Samson Veterans Monument. The event included veterans, families of past veterans, active Canadian Armed Forces members, local leaders, and their families.

It began with an honour song and a prayer, followed by a moment of silence at 11 a.m. to recognize the sacrifices of veterans. Distinguished guests shared their service stories, emphasizing the significance of the event in honouring the contributions of Indigenous peoples throughout history.

Ermineskin Cree Nation has a proud tradition of service and sacrifice that reaches far beyond our community. Members of our Nation have answered Canada's call in various conflicts, stepping up to serve in both the First and Second World Wars, among others. Indigenous peoples have played a significant role in Canada's military history, yet their contributions frequently go unrecognized. This participation is part of a broader narrative that deserves more attention. For instance, Ermineskin member Sarah Potts, along with other representatives from the Four Nations, helped establish a veterans' memorial in Maskwacis to honour those who served from their communities.



In the community, even before the official memorial took place, people came together to celebrate the courage of Indigenous veterans. A notable 1989 powwow, hosted by Ermineskin, gathered over forty veterans from Maskwacis and beyond, highlighting the rich history of service within the community.

However, the path for Indigenous veterans from Ermineskin extended beyond merely stepping onto a battlefield. It also included returning home to a society that often failed to acknowledge their contributions. Many Indigenous servicemen and women encountered discrimination when it came to accessing benefits and receiving recognition, and their stories were seldom included in mainstream commemorations. Acknowledging this disparity, the Nation, along with other Indigenous communities, adopted November 8 as Indigenous Veterans Day—a special occasion to honour the service and sacrifices of Indigenous peoples.

In Ermineskin Cree Nation, Indigenous Veterans Day serves as more than just a marked date on the calendar. It acts as a powerful reminder to honour the

names and faces of our community members who have served, while also recognizing the tremendous courage it took for Indigenous people to step forward, even as their own rights and traditions were undermined by colonial policies. An article discussing the broader Maskwacis region featured a woman from Samson Cree Nation, highlighting these views ."Our people served with courage even when they weren't treated equally. They stood on the front lines defending a country that, at home, was trying to erase them through residential schools and policies of genocide."

This day also acts as a vital link connecting the past with the future. For the Ermineskin Cree Nation, honoring veterans reflects our community's deep-seated values of leadership, sacrifice, protection, and a sense of responsibility. These principles extend to how we view our youth and future generations. By recognizing Indigenous Veterans, we reinforce the impact our community has had on shaping Canada's history and

continue to influence identity, remembrance, and accountability.




In Flanders fields the poppies blow

What Happens When You Pour Grease Down the Drain

Pouring grease, oil, or fat down your kitchen drain might seem harmless, but it can cause serious plumbing problems over time. Even if you rinse it with hot water, grease will eventually cool and harden inside your pipes. As it solidifies, it forms a sticky residue that traps food particles, hair, and other debris, leading to stubborn clogs and potential wastewater backups in your home and neighbourhood.

Further along the sewer line, grease buildup contributes to massive blockages known as "fatbergs," dense, rock-like formations made of fat, oil, and waste that can damage municipal systems and require costly repairs.

How to Dispose of Grease Properly

- Scrape it out: Let the grease cool and solidify, then scrape it into a sealable container (like an old jar or wax carton) before throwing it in the trash.
- Line a bowl: Pour grease into a parchment paper–lined bowl. Once hardened, lift out the paper, fold it up, and discard it.
- Avoid the toilet: Grease causes the same issues in toilets and sewer lines—never pour it there either.

Why You Should Change Your Furnace Filter

Your furnace filter plays a vital role in keeping your home's air clean and your heating system running efficiently. It traps dust, dirt, and allergens before they

enter your furnace. Over time, however, the filter becomes clogged, restricting airflow. This forces your furnace to work harder, increasing energy costs and potentially leading to overheating or mechanical failure.

How Often Should You Replace It?

- In Alberta's dry, dusty climate—especially during winter—filters should be checked and replaced regularly.
- Follow the arrow: Always install the filter so the arrow points toward the furnace or airflow direction.
- Adjust for lifestyle: Homes with pets, ongoing renovations, or high dust levels may need more frequent changes.
- Inspect monthly: If the filter looks dirty, replace it sooner than recommended.
- Keep it clean: Clear dust and clutter around your furnace for better airflow.
- Watch for warning signs: Unusual noises, weak airflow, or uneven temperatures signal it's time to call an HVAC professional.




